
• Located on one of the most prominent intersections in Boulder, the Municipal Buildings sits on coveted ground. Inspired by the sustainably minded, innovative culture in Boulder a soaring new roof clad in transparent solar panels sits above the existing building. It will be converted into a flexible, public exhibition space. By breathing new life into the building, turning in into a power plant and allowing creative thought to happen within - the Municipal building assumes a new identity. One that looks toward the future, yet retains its sandstone history on the exterior. microBOULDER divides the Civic site into a variety of programmatic zones which overlap, connect, and facilitate circulation through the civic heart of Boulder. The zones are programmed with a variety of functions, buildings, and landscapes that activate the area and welcome different demographics and age groups. The combination of new and existing uses reflects integral elements of Boulder's culture: outdoor sports, art, culture, festivals, innovation, entrepreneurial spirit, sustainability, academics, locally grown food, science, homegrown energy, and natural landscapes.

The proposed design renovates and re-imagines the competition area by embracing the Guiding Principles and invigorating the area with new ideas. To improve Life and Property Safety microBoulder activates each zone of the Civic Park, with both nighttime and daytime activities. Sustainability is at the core of the project with a new Net Zero energy plan, expanded tree canopy, a natural wetland discovery area, and Zero Waste infrastructure across the site. By bridging over Canyon Boulevard, closing 13th Street to commuter traffic, and creating a park between Pearl Street and Arapahoe, microBoulder links the new Civic Park to downtown.




