## **1** What is this? What am I helping to shape?

#### Forward to the Future is a

strategic sustainability planning initiative that seeks to answer the QUESTION:



In the next ten to fifteen years, how can Land Between the Lakes better **connect you** to the outdoors and **support your community** through sustainable, naturebased recreation and educational experiences?

Forward to the Future has three overarching GOALS:



To develop sustainability strategies which will position Land Between the Lakes to be environmentally, socially and economically supportable in the long term; and



To align Land Between the Lakes' practices with broader initiatives that cultivate regional sustainability through collaborative actions.

The RESULT of Forward to the Future will be a long-range Strategic Sustainability Plan. The plan

will identify Land Between the Lakes' overall strategy for outdoor recreation and environmental education and how it can contribute towards sustainability goals in two ways:

# 2 Why is it important for me to get involved? Why should I care?

Of course, the decision to participate is up to you! But here are four reasons we feel your participation is important.

- 1. Your participation helps us understand the broad, diverse and changing perspectives of those we serve. Let's face it. We're all different and we're constantly adapting to keep up with our rapidly changing world. Your voice is needed to represent the diverse public we serve so that we can weigh a variety of perspectives to help answer the questions: Where do we want to be 10-15 years from now? What impact do we want to have on surrounding communities? How might we need to shift to serve a changing America?
- 2. Your participation helps us connect future generations to the outdoors. Made widely known by Richard Louv's 2005 book, Last Child in the Woods, more and more research indicates direct exposure to natural outdoor settings is essential for healthy childhood development. However, time spent outdoors is on the decline. So, how do we keep kids connected to nature in a technological age? Your voice can help answer this question and inform: How should Land Between the Lakes benefit the lives of our children? What experiences do we want to preserve for future enjoyment?
- Your participation helps us sustain your social, economic and environmental well-

being. At the heart of our sustainability objective is a desire to expand social, economic, and

environmental benefits to you and your community through nature-based experiences. Some examples of benefits include outdoor exercise, mental health and spiritual renewal, environmental education, quality habitats for hunting and fishing, and contributions to the economic vitality of local communities through tourism-related businesses and jobs. Your voice will help us understand and

prioritize these benefits by answering the questions: How can we help people improve their auality of life and live more sustainably? How can we positively contribute to the protection of natural and cultural resources, human health and enjoyment, and the financial well-being of our surrounding communities?

#### 4. Your participation helps us turn commonalities into collaborations.

Through this effort we seek to identify areas of shared interest, both at an individual and organizational level. Our hope is to transfer fruitful exchange into volunteerism and strategic partnerships that work toward sustainability

goals. Your participation can help identify opportunities for collaboration and spark long-lasting partnerships. Your voice will help us understand where to begin by answering the questions: Where is there mutual interest and benefits? How can we align? What is better done together?







# 3 What types of input do you want from me? What is being discussed?


Together, we want to discuss and examine five topics of conversation:

### Three Opportunities for Engagement





**5** How will my ideas be used? How will they be incorporated into the strategic plan? Public input will be used to help define four key aspects of the strategic plan: 1) the desired outcomes, or desired future condition, for outdoor recreation and environmental education, 2) priorities for management actions, and 3) strategies to achieve greater sustainability, including new and innovative solutions, and 4) collaborative actions. Ultimately, public input will help shape the key components of the strategic plan, including the Vision Statement, Goals & Objectives, Key Indicators, Strategies, and list of probable short-, mid-, and long-term Tactics.



The Assessment Stage of **Forward to the Future** offers the greatest opportunity to provide input. During this stage, specific questions have been identified to guide discussions that will be the foundation for moving forward.
