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# SUMMARY

In 2012, the Lemont Park District partnered with the Solutions Resource Center at the University of St. Francis to complete a community needs assessment project as a component of an overall strategic plan. Community focus groups were held on: Monday, January 28 and Wednesday, January 30, 2013. Survey data was collected between March 1, 2013 and March 22, 2013. Survey analysis was completed in April 2013.

Highlights of the survey data include:

- Nearly all respondents (95%) felt the park district was a valuable asset to the community. When asked why, the most common responses were: Programming; Facilities and programs offered; Convenience; Brings community together; Adds value to our community; Facilities and programs; Location.
- The top four visited parks were:
  - Centennial, Covington North, Covington Knolls and Bambrick.
- The top three visited facilities were:
  - CORE indoor track, CORE programs/classes, CORE indoor pool.
- Respondents prefer to receive communication via:
  - E-mail, direct mail and the brochure.
- Most respondents prefer to register online.
- In general, respondents are satisfied with the park district and feel the parks and fields are in good condition.
- The preschool was rated as excellent (from those who listed an opinion).
- The 4<sup>th</sup> of July fireworks display was rated as excellent (from those who listed an opinion).
- The top three new facilities listed as higher priority were:
  - Biking paths/trails
  - Paths/trails that connect to one another
  - Walking paths/trails
- The top three programs listed as higher priority were:
  - Health/fitness programs
  - Community wide events
  - Environmental/nature programs
- A large majority (72%) of respondents are in favor of renting Lemont fields to outside groups (fee-based).
- A large majority (77%) were not aware of the Lemont Park Foundation and the Helping Hands Award program.
- The vast majority of respondents visit the downtown Lemont area at least once a month.
- The top reasons why respondents do not participate in recreation programs and services are: Lack of programs I'm interested in; I don't have time; Fees are too high for me.

The following report outlines the data analysis of significant factors; cross-tabulations of key correlations; qualitative data obtained from focus groups; and the compilation of all open ended comments received by the Solutions Resource Center at the University of St. Francis.

# **METHODOLOGY**

#### **Community Needs Assessment Description:**

The Lemont Park District community needs assessment project included qualitative data gathered through public focus groups and quantitative data gathered through survey research.

Focus groups are non-experimental research methods that describe the characteristics of existing opinions. In this project, the focus group method sought to identify the attributes, factors and characteristics that are important to Lemont Park District residents, the ways these factors interact and how they relate to the future of the organization.

Surveys are quantitative research. A survey seeks to gather people's opinions by measuring their responses to a set of questions. A quantitative survey draws a random sample from a population and uses those findings to demonstrate the views of the population as a whole.

#### **Participants Sample Selection:**

The population for focus group selection was identified as any individual residing in the Lemont, IL Park District boundaries. Full time employees and board members of the park district were excluded from the sample selection. A community wide invitation to attend focus groups was publicized to the Lemont Park District area community.

The population for survey research was defined as 4,000 randomly selected households within the Lemont Park District boundaries. The 4,000 identified population received a survey via direct mail. Each survey included an identifier to ensure it met the random sample selection. All residents were encouraged to respond to the survey through a series of public relations press announcements and hard copy surveys were made available at the front desk of The CORE and Centennial Building.

#### **Data Collection:**

Data was collected in two primary mediums.

Qualitative data was collected on Monday, January 28 and Wednesday, January 30, 2013 via community focus groups.

Quantitative data was collected via direct mail survey research between March 1, 2013 and March 22, 2013.

#### **Focus Group Instrument:**

The focus group instrument was developed by Dr. Lyle Hicks, USF facilitator. The instrument was a four-part agenda designed to generate discussion including a worksheet for individual input, a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) analysis, Priorities discussion and general comments.

#### **Survey Instrument:**

A survey instrument was developed incorporating input from the Lemont Park District. The 2013 survey instrument was approved on February 19, 2013 by Ms. Carrie Dellamano, Sales and Marketing Director, Lemont Park District.

#### **Measurement Scales:**

Survey data was inputted into a web instrument and downloaded into SPSS software for analysis. Respondents completing the survey online were asked to enter their identifier code as a point of validity. All codes received were cross-referenced with the random sample codes.

In addition to standard numeric analysis of each question, cross tabulations were also conducted.

# **RESULTS - RESPONSE RATE**

#### **Response Rate:**

A total of 901 number completed surveys were received by the Solutions Resource Center.

A total of 799 surveys were considered in the statistical representation of data as these were received from verified households within the random sample.

The response rate for the statistical representation of data was: 20% of the identified sample.


Based on a population of 16,000 Lemont park district residents and a random sample of 799 valid responses, the overall confidence interval and error margin for the survey are: 95% +/- 3.



Which Park District parks have members of your household visited in the past year?\*






What is or would be your preferred method to register for programs?





# **RESULTS – CROSS TABULATIONS**

Data was cross tabulated by various demographic categories. The following line items indicate correlations or themes in the cross tabulation data.

#### Parks

- Respondents with children are more likely to visit Bambrick Park than those with no children.
- Those with a higher income are more likely to visit Bambrick Park.
- Those who are aged 40-49 are more likely to visit Bambrick Park.
- Respondents who have lived in Lemont for 0-5 years are more likely to list "building new tot lots/playgrounds" as a higher priority.
- Respondents with children are more likely to feel improvements need to be made to the parks or fields.

#### The CORE

- Those who have lived in Lemont for 6-10 years are more likely to use CORE facilities than those who have lived in Lemont less than 6 years or more than 10 years.
- Those with children are more likely to use the CORE's programs/classes, indoor pool and fitness center.
- Those aged 18-39 are most likely to be a member of the CORE.

#### Centennial Outdoor Aquatic Center (Outdoor Pool)

- Respondents with children are more likely to use the outdoor pool than those without children.
- Respondents between the ages of 18-49 are more likely to use the outdoor pool.

#### Satisfaction

- Respondents with children are more likely to be satisfied with the park district versus those with no children.
- Respondents who have lived in Lemont for more than 10 years are more likely to be less satisfied than those who are newer to the community.

#### Days and Times

- The best days are times, when cross tabulated are:
  - o 9am-11am Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday
  - o 5pm-7pm, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday

# **RESULTS – FOCUS GROUPS**

As a component of the community needs assessment, focus groups were conducted to gather qualitative feedback from the community on various aspects of the park district.

Dr. Lyle L. Hicks, Executive Director, Center for Innovation and Leadership, University of St. Francis and Mrs. Jackie Bersano, Community Partnership Manager, University of St. Francis, facilitated two focus groups held on January 28, 2013 and January 30, 2013. The purpose of the focus group discussions were to obtain feedback from residents of the community served by the park district and identify strengths and weaknesses/challenges of programs, services, and facilities; and to provide input on the future direction of the park district.

Each session was approximately sixty (60) minutes in length. The discussion topics included response categories for: programs, services, staff, and facilities.

Most participants strongly agree or agree that youth programming and customer service are two major strengths of the park district. They find administrative staff to be helpful, attentive and readily available to answer questions. Participants also indicated that special event planning (i.e. Easter, Halloween, and other holiday events/programs) are well attended and the park district offers a variety of special event programming for families.

Another strength of the park district is the partnership program with other park districts where Lemont residents are able to use and take advantage of neighboring park district facilities and programs. However, some residents indicated that not many residents served by the neighboring park districts make use of Lemont Park District facilities. Also, focus group participants indicate that even though the size of Lemont Park District is small compared to neighboring park districts such as Bloomingdale Park District or Roselle Park District, it promotes a sense of community and stability to residents.

One of the challenges facing the park district is to be able to maximize the use of technology. For example, most participants suggested the park district needs to upgrade its web site, make better use of online registration, and implement additional marketing strategies which make use of electronic media capabilities. Other suggestions from focus group participants indicate there is a need to offer more programming for seniors; and a need to work more closely with the Lemont School District to be able to offer more after school programming for children.

Other challenges facing the park district involve making improvements in open space areas such as creating more walking paths in parks, improving the maintenance of ball fields, tennis courts, picnic and playground areas. In general, most participants indicated that the main recreation building and its facilities are well maintained, but expressed concern over the safety and maintenance of open space areas.

The majority of focus group participants that participate in recreation programs are satisfied with the quality and knowledge of program instructors. Some participants expressed there may be a need for the park district to upgrade the level of training for volunteers and coaches participating in youth sports.

Potential action steps and priorities listed by focus group participants indicate there is a need to:

- develop a communication and marketing plan,
- review both risk management plan and deferred maintenance plan procedures,
- find other funding sources, and
- focus on small projects to build success but do not put a strain on the budget.

Overall, focus group participants stated they are satisfied with park district leadership and quality of programs offered.

Overview: There were a total of 11 people participating in the focus group sessions. Attendees included residents who:

- Participate in senior citizen fitness activities and attend special events,
- Have children who participate in swim classes, attend pre-school programs, and are heavy users of other children oriented programs, and
- Participate in adult fitness classes, play racquet ball, make use of all CORE facilities, use outdoor park areas, participate in family oriented activities and take advantage of summer programming.

- There should be more focus on "public" recreation philosophy versus "commercial" recreation philosophy – Does special interest get in the way of serving the needs of the residential community?
- Collaborations with other area park districts on developing partnerships
- Customer service training for front desk staff at Continental/CORE facilities

#### Opportunities:

- Potential for creating more walking trails, bike paths and connecting and/or developing regional open space areas.
- Sponsorship/Partnership development
- Alternative approaches to different types of CORE membership and Family packages
- Form partnerships for grant development for LPD projects/programs
- Map of open space "Discover Lemont Outdoors"
- Create a multiple organization web site which would include various organizational programming, services, events, projects, special events, etc.
- Continue to explore alternative approaches to community development with various stakeholders and "interest" groups
- Meet with health care systems vying for space in Lemont
- Explore use of open space areas, land acquisition, and grant development
- Create themes that community stake holders can buy into such as a focus on child hood obesity and access to healthy nutrition, community gardening, concerts in the park, and etc.

The schools - park district need better communication - Recent example - Volleyball on Fri March 1st was cancelled due to school being closed that day and the Park did not know until 6pm when they went to River Valley to set-up the nets and were unable to enter the locked school; this type of miscommunication has been going on since at least 1999

And how much did this survey cost?

Aqua aerobics programs are quickly becoming too expensive. They are nearly \$1200 per year and approximately 95% of the participants are seniors on fixed incomes.

Aqua aerobics uses outdoor pool which does not have a heater + water is sometimes very cold on cold days.

As long as Core keeps the same standard of people as members I will continue my membership. So far it has been great I feel comfortable leaving change of clothing in locker room.

Asking for a scale in the old building Centennial.

Briarcliff park update plea - we have only 2 swings and they are for babies. Older kids have no opportunities to swing. We have kiddie slides only and for some reason there is a 5ft drop off so that is not really safe for small kids to play on. And...what is the purpose of the purple dino?

Condition of the CORE indoor pool is too cold.

Consider creating a weekly free class for the community (residents). In the winter, open a rink.

Considering the percent of senior group in Lemont, the Core complex is very deficient in low impact cardio equipment. Lots of treadmills, but no step type equipment. Huge oversight in serving fitness needs of the community.

Core fees should be lower. They are almost the same as LA Fitness and there is no mortgage to pay - should be lower for residents.

Core fitness center weight room over crowded with teens/young adults after 5:00 pm on weekdays.

CORE gym is dirty, dusty. Locker rooms needs more frequent mopping/cleaning. Change custodians.

Core is way to expensive for residents- non-resident should pay higher fees

Cost of the Core is too high. In these bad economic times and when folks are still laid off...and we need to takes care of ourselves, but don't have the resources because the prices are too high. What a shame!

Could we get another news channels on the TV in CORE...i.e. CNN? I find the current news stations a bit right of center.

Covington North, always clean. If there is ever a problem I call and it is taken care of immediately.

Do not put in a sports complex it will cost the taxpayers and has not worked in other suburbs.

Does the Core make money? You need transparency - no budget of financial info on website. Why?

Enough soccer fields, football fields, and playgrounds. Part time employment.

Equipment, mats are not cleaned, for the classes which they are offered.

Find ways to lower your operating costs. Not ways to spend more tax dollars. What is this survey costing me?

Fitness classes at after work times are earlier than 7.

Generally speaking, the Lemont Park District continues to suffer from poor customer service and inadequate equipment. The baseball and soccer fields are poorly maintained, and the indoor running track is losing its traction. The Core can do a lot better, in my opinion.

Go look at the new Darien park district....it's great for the preschoolers. Hire someone to run some birthday parties that are really creative. Again, look at the Darien PD, low fees for a fabulous party! The park district could get a lot of money this way because all the preschool parents are going to Jump Zone just so someone else can run and clean up the party.

Have additional music/painting classes for toddlers, they're always full.

Have enough equipment. Make sure it is always and not dirty. Pushing people to clean up after they use the exercise equipment. Keeping the fees competitive with other gyms.

High school has too much access to pool - need to get their own.

How about letting those people who want the park district pay for it instead of those who never use it!

I am not a fan of the new swim lesson offered. It seems to be less time, more money. Now they are only 30 minutes long, before they used to be 45 minutes. It seems that the lessons are over before the kids can get enough out of them. after the line-ups and warm-ups, they get 10 minutes of instruction. I will not be signing my kids up for these lessons again.

I am sick and tired of seeing people that are not from Lemont using our facilities. There are times that I am walking on the track & I look down & feel like I am in a ghetto. The fee difference for residents vs. non -residents is not high enough. Many other park districts charge a much higher fee to take their classes, which in my opinion is the way it should be. When a households registers to join the Core- do you actually ask for proof of who is living in the house? I feel that many of the folks that use the Core for basketball, do not all live in Lemont but add their name as a household member when joining. When I walk the paths in the summer, the entire outdoor basketball courts are being used by African Americans & when I look at stickers on their cars- none are from Lemont. Can't something be done about this? Also, the young girls checking ID's at front desk are very lax. Sometimes they check my ID- sometimes they don't.

I am unincorporated D.G. with Lemont P.O. - cannot use library- can I use park district facilities?

I believe Lemont residents especially teens & young adults should receive priority when applying for employment at park districts. Many non-residents work at park. One of my children, (young adult) applied 5 times and was never called however her friend a Lockport resident was hired.

I can barely afford pool classes and gave up Core membership because poop and yoga not included.

I cancelled my core membership in the summer because there is no open gym during adult class time. There is no open gym for kids on days of school unless the high school is of also. Outdoor pool crowded during peak hours because ALL the camp kids have pool time during the same time. Could this be staggered?

I currently go to Lifetime fitness, but attend senior yoga at the park district. I think about joining the Core, but have not because I spend time with my grandchildren at the pool and climbing wall at Lifetime. I am very satisfied with my yoga class and think it would be closer and less expensive at the Core to workout.

I do not like the men's locker room. The lockers are too small. And there are not enough showers.

I do not wish to see useless spending of our tax dollars. Too much waste goes on in Lemont. We need to lower our taxes!

I do remember taking yoga in the park dist building and the environment just wasn't yoga-friendly. But am looking forward to a Zumba class

I do wish we could set up a texting system for cancellations or changes to classes.

I dropped my core membership because it wasn't a benefit to me. If aquatic classes were included in membership like the other classes, it would be worth rejoining even at a slightly higher rate.

I feel that is you are a member of the core - additional programs be offered at a discounted price and/or a senior discount. Also, maintenance of heart rate monitors need to be maintained on treadmills - cardiac rehab patients need this feature to monitor their workout

I have gym/workout equipment in my home. I use exercise DVDs/Tapes for my workouts.

I have heard the classroom fitness classes are too small for the number of people crammed inside.

I know very little about the LPD and was surprised by this survey as to offerings. Might be beneficial to advertise/market more. Where is info such as parks location described? Thanks.

I like the facilities and use them religiously. I have met lots of friendly people through the classes, which I enjoy, exercise has become fun! Thanks The Core.

I liked golf lessons at Cog Hill

I think an employee should be available on the floor for assistance in fitness center. I am questioned by seniors, am I using equipment right? Don't feel I am qualified to answer. Question on swimming is it just classes or what can you just go in and use pool?

I think our parks are very well run and equipped. I was going to join when the initiation fee was waived but I missed the deadline. I have intentions of maybe joining if that fee is waived in the future.

I think that Bambrick baseball fields need to be maintained at a higher level. This also includes the grass areas in Bambrick. Also any Lemont resident should be able to use the basketball courts without paying a fee. Thanks.

I use a personal trainer. I don't think you offer that service.

I use the treadmill at the Core - and I don't believe they have a preventative maintenance contract on any of the machines.

I used to attend fitness classes but due to limited size of rooms and sometimes not getting in, I have stopped.

I wish it wasn't so expensive to swim and use the exercise equipment.

I wish members could get some priority for open gym during peak hours. I often go there with my kids for 30-45mins + I have to pay \$4 for each kid as they are not members. That adds up to a lot of money for 30mins. Members should have available space during peak hours sometimes.

I work during the day and I have arthritis. I don't' think I should pay extra for water classes - I have a Core membership - I cannot take any other classes.

I work late nights so any program offered after 3 p.m. runs into my bed time.

I work odd hours.

I work with LITH center.

I would favor renting Lemont fields for outside use if the process is transparent and regulated to avoid any mishandling of funds as was the case a few years ago with a previous director.

I would like to see instructional posters of various movements in the workout area near all the weights. I would like to see an area where people can congregate and talk, have a snack, etc. before or after working out. Couches, tables - conversational areas for people to gather instead of going to Starbucks.

I would like to see martial arts programs/courses offered.

I would like to see the park district walk/jogging path cleared after it snows. It is a safety hazard to leave snow/ice on a walking path-downers grove clears its walk path after snow storm - safety first!

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I would love to be able to participate...but cannot afford it.

If I sign my daughter up for tennis I sort of expect her to learn tennis and not play goofy games around the court this is nothing to do with tennis. Just wastes her time while the teacher lounges around. I had this issue 2 years in a row. So now none of my kids will take tennis through the park district.

If this is about the new sports facility downtown, I don't agree that we need this. Downtown Lemont won't be from this new complex. I don't think we need a new facility, especially downtown.

I'm sorry, I tried to complete this survey out. Much doesn't apply to my husband and me. We are in mid-eighties. We use only walking paths and core's indoor track. This survey applies more to younger families.

In these times, the focus should be on providing the community with bottom-line services and a close eye on finances. Building bigger, more expensive community buildings that a small percent of the community use overburdens taxpayers. Focus on cost cutting and saving - run the park district with non-union part-timers.

It just makes me sick when I go by these facilities. All the money dumped into what the manufactures need of the residents and the feel good about yourselves and your well -fed egotistical idealism paid for by my sweat. Government steals way too much of my money. Old enough to know that the citizens have let it all get out of hand. Government is way out of line. Way too big across the board. Even you people! The bigger is gets the closer we get to it all coming down. (Researcher note: 7 pages of national/regional political opinion articles were enclosed with survey. Only the resident's direct comments have been transcribed.)

It would be great if the Core could be open at 6:00 am on Saturdays.

It's very difficult to access the gym and pool when they are being used so much for leagues and swim meets. This is not fair to Core members. And the parking at these events is absolutely atrocious!! In the fitness room there often are no towels and equipment is not working and dirty. Not to mention when the women's locker room is closed because for cleaning.

I've been taking my son to your indoor pool for 2 years and was just recently told he can't be in pool unless I am in water with him. For this reason, I have now been going to Lockport pool. I will always be in same room, but don't want to swim in pool. Please reconsider changing this rule to have parents in rooms, but don't need to be in pool.

I've only lived here 1 year - still learning the area. I have a 2.5 year old son and a 4 month old daughter. I love the geography of the town and how Republican it is.

Keep non-residents out of facilities.

Larger warmer pool please.

Lemont's pool should have been built to be a destination for neighboring communities. Instead we go there.

Like to swim, but indoor pool uses salt water; this is bad for hair and skin. Why can't they just use regular water and add chlorine? Also, make sure swim lanes are open to the public in the evening and on the weekends.

Locker room at Core is poor quality.

Looking for a low cost tai chi class. Good for all ages and all states of health. Its free in chinatown, but it's too far.

Lots of my local mom friends and I have talked about how a little splash pad like Hippos at Bolingbrook would be wonderful to have in the downtown Lemont area. We visit splash pads with our kids 2 times per week in the summer and buy lunch after. If we could spend dollars at local Lemont businesses that would be even better.

Love the remodel. We live in Kensington estates, it feels isolated because of no bike paths. The park district is well maintained and open to everyone. I love how beautiful it is at the park district and it has been integral in keeping me in shape. The village should be very proud.

Lower the membership fee of the CORE.

Make it pay as you go instead of sucking out money in form of taxes for things residents never use.

Many more senior activities at different times are needed.

Many park district expansion is not needed at a time when gov. needs to be shrunk. There is only so much money to feed programs, and to start more cost to start and maintain them.

Many people can barely make their mortgage, stop spending our tax money. This is a recession.

Minimal free weights.

Mom & Son night was not what I expected. Too much watching the boys playing instead of interacting with them.

More chairs for outdoor pool. Plant more trees especially to shade playgrounds. Build a playground like Harvester Park (Burr Ridge). More for older.

More men's boot camps.

More security, hire or ask residents to volunteer. I love across from Keepata in Will County there was a lot of problems with gang activity. I called police many times and it is okay now. My son is a police officer and says park district is where there is a lot of gang activity.

More weights please. Kick the young kids out that are just hanging out and not lifting. Please!

My daughter loves the swimming lessons, but we cannot commit to 2x/wk. Would like to do a 1hr swim lesson on just 1 day.

My family participates in lots of activities with district

My husband used your exercise equipment and pool. I use the walking track at Core. He passed away last October, so I don't get there now.

Employment status: babysit grandchildren 4 days a week.

My age and income are none of your business.

My kids cannot use the Core fitness center without me- other gyms it's not a problem. So we use another gym.

Need day trips or seniors to live theater Chicago.

Need locked room where someone can shower and put on a suit and tie. Need to change what is there now as cannot use Core in the morning= big problem. Also must go home to change before I come.

New proposed sports field will only prove to be another waste of space. Used by a select few and cost village overall more money to cover police control. Garbage clean up and still no one will shop or eat downtown.

No new taxes from 2012 levels. Parks are good, just maintain to their present level.

Now that kids are grown, we don't use Park District. Husband and I both belong to outside health club. Used park district when kids were small for sports and classes. club on east side of town would be nice to see facilities on this end as well.

Offer more times and days for semi-private and private swim lessons.

Online pool schedule needs to be accurate.

Organized sports is already offered in schools. We shouldn't offer the same program in the park district.

Other than walk-bike trails, everything else is adequate. Would like to see more frolfing nets in already establish areas. No need for more fields of any kind-tired on looking at empty spaces.

Our fields really need to be improved. Offer concession stand so that our travel teams and in house teams can host tournaments. Need bathroom facilities at Bambrick. Many kids leaving our town to play elsewhere.

Outdoor hockey rink would be wonderful.

Overall the park district does a great job. Larger events are a great way to get families together especially downtown. We need to keep travel teams from going outside Lemont to practice, especially softball and baseball.

Park district is in debt 18 million dollars. Bad leadership - debt - pensions.

Park District should look at increasing seating area at the Indoor Pool. If done, the swim team can host large weekend USA events. These events typically bring in revenue of \$10,000 - \$15,000 per meet. The cost of adding seats could be offset over time with the profit from the USA meets. The locker room lockers are also too small.

Please consider lowering outdoor pool fees.

Please do more to Bambrick - it is a large facility that can be a premier sports complex. Get Citgo to do more to it!

Please keep the park simple, many people are taxed for all those amenities that are not necessary. Private fitness centers are out there for the people who want them. The park budget is equal to the fire department which is necessary for our safety. This survey is costing how much?

Prefer not to answer financial info below.

Program is at bad time.

Programs are cancelled.

Programs for pre-teens and teens come with limited times/days. Need more of a selection. Many children need to attend school activities immediately after school which is when the pk district's programs are usually offered. Need later times for this age group.

Quit spending. So much money on parks etc., don't need any new ones - STOP, find ways of lowering taxes not just spend. Give back to Lemont people so they can afford to stay here.

Same time as week. 6am or 5am would be good too.

Seriously, we have a 6 children and are NOT rich, we cut corners, and hardly ever use the park dist. due to way high prices! No one cares that there are larger families out there, maybe you can consider families in Lemont that have more than 4 or 5 children, put a cap on the fee's...please consider this.

Should let people use core gym more affordable could and do go to Palos health care for same price and don't pay property taxes there. Soccer fields could use permanent nets.

Some of the instructors and many of the participants are from Lemont. At the Lockport facility on Mon Wed Fri 10am to noon + Tues Thur @ 6-8 pm.

Start an environmental club to make Lemont greener.

Subs are needed for classes.

Survey has limited value for someone retired with children out of house. May want to sort by age to gain better handle on needs for this age group - not dilute needs for.

Take cash for programs you offer. Every night around outdoor pool during the season cement and chairs need to be hosed down. Brand new towel last year - got knocked off my chair somebody stepped on it. There was gum on the underside of towel. Threw towel out. Thanks for asking.

Thanks to our Park Bd. Com.! Promote cycling, kayaking/canoeing - more programs are not always better. Try to focus on what you do best & what is most popular & do more of those types of activities.

The Core indoor pool I feel was only built for the Lemont swim team and to cater to little children and their parents for swim lessons. This is why I do not attend the aqua aerobics class anymore. The Core pool land are too few and not big enough to facilitate the class size and the growing neighborhood.

The CORE is a complete joke. It is not a community facility. It is a private club. My family cannot afford to use the facilities. We haven't yet bought a season pass to the outdoor pool because the fee is too high. You have out priced your own residents from using the facilities. It's disgusting.

The Core should add a Steam room and/or Sauna. I'm not sure why Lemont needs so many Basketball courts. The Core along with the grammar schools and old park district building have plenty of basketball courts. The Outdoor pool needs additional chairs/seating.

The idea of having this soccer type park downtown is terrible. We have lots of parks that are underutilized. They need to be used. It will definitely fail. Fix the schools instead.

The only program I would like to see improved at the core is the massage therapy. The area that is set aside for it is ridiculous. No privacy, etc.

The park district could add adult dance, art, and language programs. Lemont has many programs for the young and very old - nothing in between. The 4th of July fireworks are wonderful but certainly worth the expense in a slow economy. Too many young people working at the core with very little adult supervision on the weekends - they don't enforce the rules. Charge more for non-residents!

The pool is my main form of exercise, and due to my work hours, the only time I can use the pool is on the weekends. The swim teams seem to have a monopoly on the pool in the late afternoon and into the early evening on Monday through Friday.

The pool needs more deck room maybe a indoor water slide. Bldg 9 outdoor ice rink for winter with a tubing hill, along with climbing stairs like at swallow cliffs

The walking track is a mess - please fix.

There have been times I haven't been notified of a cancelled class. Recently the snow days have been ridiculous! Cancelled classes that should not have been, some not cancelled forcing people out when the news was telling people to stay off the roads.

Times are inconvenient.

Times do not fit schedule. Please put lights on the tennis courts. It would be great to have a place for families to play at night.

Too expensive for a family. some of the kids cannot use all cause of age. Too expensive.

Top priority would be bike paths in and around Lemont especially connecting out to McArthur.

Was a member of fitness ctr prior to CORE. Will be checking out facilities including indoor track. Outdoor pool excellent for all ages. Grandchildren enjoy parks and pool.

Water in indoor pool is too cold - need to make warmer.

We are older, all we need is paths to walk. Some summer concerts would be nice.

We could learn a lot from Bolingbrook park district. They have wonderful facilities, programs, and prices and very competitive as well. We in fact still go to Bolingbrook for Karate (shotokan) and swimming. Programs are also friendly for all the ages.

We just recently moved to Lemont so we look forward to taking advantage of the park district soon!

We moved to this area recently. We are glad there is a park district. We lived in Homer Glen for 35 years, high taxes and no Park District.

We used the park district when our children were in school. They took classes, little league, ayso tennis lessons, etc. we were always satisfied. The park district offers more now than it ever did. It seems fine as it is.

When I visit downtown Lemont area 2-3 times per month it is only to go to Post Office and leave. I shop or dine in downtown Lemont only 2-3 times per year due to lack of shops or restaurants I want to visit.

When travel teams use the gyms, one gym is reserved for open gym--but only for certain ages. I don't think that's right. Members should have priority--no matter what their age. Facilities should be restricted to residents.

Why do you need race info?

Work with village to support the sports complex - bring in more large scale tournament s- revenue stream - to help lower fee for in village families. Plus it will help the tax base in town.

Would have been nice for pool to be a little more like a water park. The lazy river isn't.

Would like to be able to drop in on a class and pay that day.

Would love to have the park district invest in an ice arena for skating and hockey. Also, consider improving instruction and teacher quality of programs. We go elsewhere for soccer, basketball, tennis, dance and gymnastics due to quality issues.

You have had the same classes/programs for years. think outside the box. The huge amount of kids that were first here with the initial Lemont growth are now going off to college. How about sponsoring some clubs bass fishing, canoeing, bicycling. Things that you don't find in our area. I would have used the land they want for the sports center for something another person suggested - the camping outdoor venue with a amphitheater for plays. Woodridge has that and boy/girl scouts, church groups YMCA use the site. We have it there right along the river/canal. Like a little red school house. I would turn all the downtown into housing/museum type thing. I would go there to walk/bike, see concerts, plays. I would not to purchase anything that I can run to the corner Jewel/Chipains rather than wind all the way through streets and stop signs to get downtown. There is not enough flow otherwise to generate sustainable business. ADVERTISE. in all papers web sites etc. people won't come if they don't know about it.

You need to develop programs attractive to educated, active seniors. Too many of the "for seniors" programs are juvenile and patronizing. Facilities that would have been beneficial to seniors were cancelled for cost reasons - i.e. therapy pool at the core. Focus is on children and young families.
